

Content

Aim: To investigate the impact of feeder road development on inclusive growth and productive employment (comparative study of a few (3 or 4) different agro-ecological areas in Tigray)

- Employment generation in road development (numbers and kinds of jobs, equity issues, labour safety aspects)
- Post-construction employment generation and impact on local economies (e.g. empowerment of labourers and contractors, local employment environment, inward- and outward migration/mobilities)
- 3. Impact of roads on the natural environment in particular soil erosion and hydrology, and their impact on livelihood
